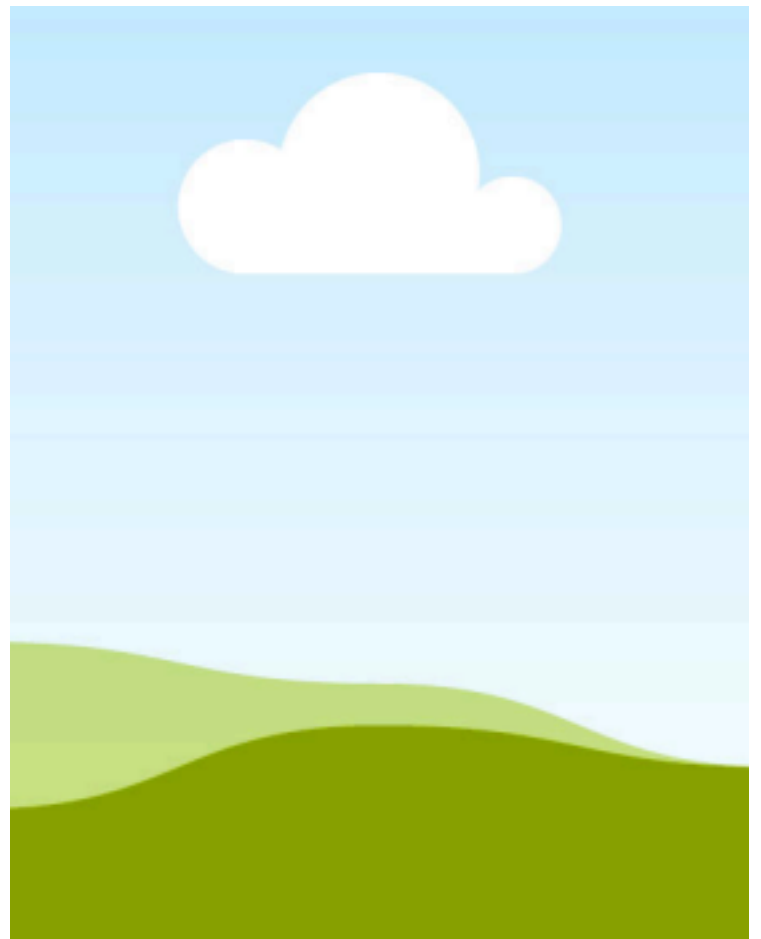
National and International Award Competitions UNITY's competitions showcased student projects that excelled in creativity and problem-solving. In
